Notes to the standalone financial results

1 The audited standalone Financial Results for the year ended 30 June 2023 and unaudited standalone Financial Results for the quarter ended 30 June 2023 were reviewed by the Audit Committee and were approved by the Board of Directors in its meeting held on 27 July 2023. The statutory auditors, Deloitte Haskins & Sells LLP have expressed an unmodified opinion conclusion. The Statement has been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the Indian Accounting Standards prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with the relevant rules thereunder and the terms of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended. The figures for the quarter ended 30 June 2023 and 30 June 2022 are the balancing figures between audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the published unaudited year to date figures upto third quarter of the respective financial years. Based on the "management approach" as defined in Ind AS 108-Operating Segments, the Chief Operating Decision Maker evaluates the Company's performance as a single business segment namely travel and transportation vertical.

The Exceptional items for the quarter ended 31 March 2023 and year ended 30 June 2023 consist of profit on sale of Property, Plant & Equipment (1st floor of Building 'Sharada 6

The Board of Directors has recommended a final dividend of Rs. 30/- per equity share, subject to the approval of the shareholders at the ensuing Annual General Meeting.

We conducted our review of the Standalone Financial Results for the quarter ended June 30, 2023 in accordance with the Standard on Review Engagements ("SRE") 2410 'Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity', issued by the ICAL A review of interim financial information consists of making inquiries, primarily of the Company's personnel responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with SAs specified under section 143(10) of the Act and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Other Matter

The Statement includes the results for the Quarter ended June 30, 2023 being the balancing figure between audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the published year to date figures up to the third quarter of the current financial year which were subject to limited review by us. Our report on the Statement is not modified in respect of this matter.
